### PREVIOUS WEEK INFORMATION:

- The newly revised calendar for 2022-2023 will include eLearning Days which will be asynchronous learning days for our students to allow time for our teachers to have in depth professional development. Those dates are October 7, November 8, and February 16. We have connected those days with breaks to minimize the impact for our families. Once the Governance Board approves the calendar, we will post this information on our website.
- The Centers for Disease Control has new guidelines around masking. They are as follows:

When teachers, staff, and students consistently and correctly wear a mask, they protect others as well as themselves. Consistent and correct mask use is especially important indoors and in crowded settings, when physical distancing cannot be maintained.

- **Indoors:** CDC recommends indoor masking for all\* individuals ages 2 years and older, including students, teachers, staff, and visitors, regardless of vaccination status.
- **Outdoors:** In general, people do not need to wear masks when outdoors. CDC recommends that people who are not fully vaccinated wear a mask in crowded outdoor settings or during activities that involve sustained close contact with other people. Fully vaccinated people might choose to wear a mask in crowded outdoor settings, especially if they or someone in their household is immunocompromised.

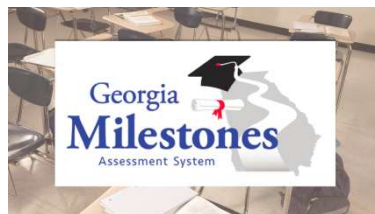
*Students and staff at LPA will continue wearing mask until the guidelines recommend otherwise.*

**PETITION RENEWAL UPDATES**

- **The Governance Board has filed the letter of intent with the DeKalb County School District and the Georgia Department of Education that it intends to submit a renewal petition in August of 2022. A number of events will need to occur between now and the actual submission. During the month of March, we will be hosting listening tours to hear from you about why we need charter schools in our area. Leadership Preparatory Academy opened its doors in 2010 and was developed by a group of community members from various walks of life who envisioned an academic powerhouse for students in South DeKalb. Since then, LPA, has served over three thousand students and have received praise for its consistent academic performance since its inception. - The Georgia Promotion, Placement, and Retention Law and SBOE Rule 160-4-2-.11 mandates the following:
  - All third-grade students must achieve grade level scores on the state-adopted assessment (End of Grade-EOG) in Reading to be promoted.
  - All fifth-grade students must have achieved grade level scores in Reading and Mathematics on the state-adopted assessment (EOG) to be promoted.
  - All eighth-grade students must have achieved grade level scores in Reading and Mathematics state adopted assessment (EOG) to promoted.
- Students who score Below Grade Level in reading and/or in Beginning Learner achievement level in mathematics are retained under these provisions and must participate in the EOG retest administration.
- Breakfast and Lunch Menus are available online. Students can pick up breakfast from the cafeteria each morning – Lower School 7:30 am – 7:50 am and Upper School – 7:45 am – 8:05 am

Your child’s teacher is the first person you should contact when you have questions or concerns about instruction. Please feel free to copy Mrs. Turner and/or Dr. Williams. In order to ensure that we are adequately providing you with accurate information, the person’s name you place in the **TO line**, is the person who will respond. Teachers and administrators usually respond with 24 hours however, we will respond within 48 hours. - Thank you to the parents who have updated the consent forms. We will utilize our **test to stay strategy** for all classes that have 100% of their students participating in the testing program at the school. Unfortunately, we have a few families who are not sending in test results or participating in the testing program at LPA. **As a result of this, if we have a positive case in that classroom, where we do not have 100% participation, we will pivot to eLearning.**
- **STUDENTS MUST WEAR A SURGICAL MASK EACH DAY TO SCHOOL. PLEASE PLACE AN ADDITONAL MASK IN STUDENT’S BOOKBAG SO, THAT CAN CHANGE WHEN THEY NEED TO. We are monitoring the data and the guidance from CDC, to make a determination on when we will be able to lighten our mask mandate.**

- Each scholar should have a pair of headphones in their bookbags each day for their school issued computer.
- Remember to provide your scholar with a fresh bottle of water each day.
- Please remember to follow our procedures for early dismissal. Remember that we do not have anyone sitting at the front desk. All of us are working directly with students. We would appreciate you scheduling appointments on days we are out of school. The school recognizes that this is not always possible therefore, we ask that you follow our early dismissal procedure. We need our scholars in the classroom. We have so much time to make up for and we appreciate your support in this area.
